Following the provisional appointment of Rev Novette Headley as Superintendent Minister for the Bristol & South Gloucestershire Circuit from September this year, the Circuit Invitation Committee have been informed that Novette has been nominated as Chair of the Birmingham District from September 2022.

Novette will still take up her appointment with us in August, but this will only be for 12 months. We have been informed that finding a replacement for September 2022 will be a priority for the District, working with regional and connexional colleagues.

Whilst this is disappointing news for the Circuit, we recognise that all stationing appointments are provisional until they are confirmed at The Methodist Conference. We are however delighted that Novette has been appointed as a Chair of District and look forward to working with her this coming year and assure her of our support and blessings for the future.
